#### MESSAGE FROM OUR INTERIM MODERATOR

#### Hello Friends,

My name is Rev Barbara Ann Sweetin, and I am the Interim Moderator and Locum for Houston & Killellan Kirk for the foreseeable future.

Many of you will know me already, as I lived in Houston from 1982 to 2011 before I became a minister and moved to take up my position at East and Old Church in Forfar.

I have taken early retirement and moved back to the area and was asked to help out by covering the Sunday Services and working two days a week to cover pastoral issues. This is called locum work, which I am paid for.

My role as Interim Moderator is a voluntary one, and I took it on to help Houston & Killellan Kirk and Presbytery. It sees me become a trustee of the church and I have been appointed to it by the Presbytery of Clyde. In this role I look after Houston & Killellan Kirk as though I am the full time minister, making sure all rules and regulations are being upheld and preparing the church – the Kirk Session and members of the Kirk – for the hoops they need to jump through to get a new minister.

When new ministers come looking for a church, they want to see an active church that has continued to do God's work even during a time of vacancy, as well as starting new initiatives, so we cannot rest on our laurels.

Houston & Killellan Kirk has lots of attributes that will attract a minister, but we will need to work hard to bring other areas up to a better standard. If you see me around the area, please come and say hello!

## The Kirk's hire calling: An update...

HOUSTON & Killellan Kirk is currently in what is known as 'a vacancy', which means that the church doesn't have its own full-time minister and will need to advertise for a new one, once all the necessary boxes have been ticked and we are able to do so. Unfortunately, it is a long process, but we will keep you updated with what is happening.

At the moment there are two stumbling blocks: firstly, under the Presbytery plan for our area, Houston & Killellan Kirk will have to have either a union, or a linkage, with Langbank Church.

Discussions between the Kirk Sessions of both Houston & Killellan Kirk and Langbank Church are underway. Once both Sessions reach agreement – which may take some time – we will seek the views of all our Elders. Both Houston & Killellan Kirk and Langbank Church Sessions will vote on it before the matter goes to a congregational vote.

We will hold a meeting with the congregation ahead of that vote, to make sure that everybody understands what they are voting on, and what the outcome of the vote will mean for our church.

The second stumbling block is the Manse; all manses will soon be required to a minimum of a 'C' rating for energy efficiency and at present our Manse is a 'D'. The good news is that work on the property can be carried out while we are resolving the first matter with Langbank Church.

We will keep you updated on all of this.

HOUSTON & Killellan Kirk Book Club are a friendly group who get together once a month.


We take it in turns to choose a book for everyone to read - and enjoy lively discussions about what we thought of each one and whether we liked it.

THE money raised recently through our Eggs-ellent Christmas presents (£570.37) and Luxury Pop-Up Breakfast (£1,144.24) has been sent to our Mission partners, Keith and Ida, to help support the Chicken Project.

Unfortunately they had difficulties getting baby chicks, so there was a delay between the previous batch reaching the end of their egg-laying days and their replacements coming into lay. To bridge the gap we covered the costs of the additional feed when they had no income to pay the workers. Happily the chicks are doing well and will soon start laying.

Keith and Ida are coming back to Scotland on furlough in May and June this year when we will look forward to welcoming them and hearing their news. They plan to visit us on the weekend of June 22 and 23.

In Mwandi when disaster strikes there are always willing helpers. Recently the home of a single mum who has five children collapsed – but the church choir stepped in and helped to



build a new one. What a fabulous community!

Our regular parcels of baby clothes are always very welcome, and we can take any clothing items (not shoes) that are used, but in excellent condition, or new, for babies and young children aged from birth to five years and post them to Mwandi. Our Nativity Service was a big hit with the congregation; well done to all our Sunday Club children and volunteers who worked so hard to make it such a success.


